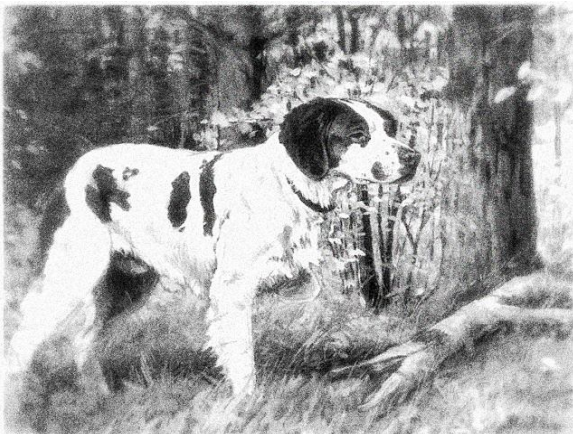
A Glimpse of History

THROUGH THE YEARS...

1978 - IN THE BEGINNING

The Central Maine Brittany Club was formed because people who owned Brittany's did not have their own dog club. At that time the only bird dog club in Maine was the Maine Bird Dog Club. Because it was an “American Field” club, the Brittany was not afforded the chance to become a dual champion without going out of state to field trial and earn points towards it’s championship.

Harry Lisewski, Dwight (Pete) Jordan and Frank Pride Jr. were actually the ones that started the club. The first letter from Harry to Frank was dated Feb 19, 1978. Harry appointed himself as Secretary of Maine Brittany and appointed Frank as the nominating committee of the “XXXXXX XXXXX Regional Brittany Club“. It was stated in that letter that “it is important that we have good officers and directors if this club is to be successful“. This is just as true 30 years later in 2008 as it was when the club was formed in 1978.

“According to the constitution prepared along with the American Brittany Club guidelines we need a President, 3 Vice Presidents and a Secretary and a Treasurer. The VP’s are as follows: 1st VP takes over for the President and is in charge of all the matters pertaining to the field trials: 2nd VP is in charge of obtaining new memberships: and the 3rd VP is in charge of all matters pertaining to dog shows. We also need three more people to serve as directors along with the officers who are directors.”

The first meeting was held on April 9th, 1978 in the meeting room of the Canal National Bank in North Windham, we had so many people that we could not get them all in the meeting room. The first CMBC club President was Harry Lisewski, Secretary- Pete Jordan, Treasurer – Donna Pride, 1st VP- Frank Pride Jr., Although I do not have records for the rest of the officers we do think that Don Towle, Ray Wilson, were part of the original. Stan Short Jr., Carolyn Lisewski, Catherine Jordan, Walter Young, Brenda & Dick Cormier, Charles & Gordeen Noble were also involved. I also want to mention Bob Paucek who was never a member but for 30 years remained a supporter and an important part of our club with all the help he’s gives with seminars and judging our trials.



Our first sanctioned field trial was held at Maynard Albee farm in Wiscasset in the fall of 1979. Some of the handlers were Stan Short Jr. Russell Menard, Pete Jordan, Bob Fleury, Frank Pride Jr., Don Towle for Ray Wilson, Pat LaBree for owner Dr Meyer, and Joe Wessling. Also present were Ralph and Mary Sleeper, Leon Pride, Walter Pride, Leslie Fleury, Carmen & Leland Griffin, Ron Stevenson and Horace Aliff. Judges were Pat LaBree, Bob Fleury, Bob Paucek, Walter Young, Pete Jordan.



One thing I do remember about this trial is that was it was brutally hot and Leslie Fleury (who never was seen in shorts!) cut off a new pair of dungarees because she could not stand the heat. Also Carmen was a marshal and Ron Stevenson and Pudge Aliff had a great time following the braces. Leon, Walter and Ralph Sleeper were the bird planters with our little Datsun truck and I also remember the amount of cans that were in the back of it at the end. Bob Fleury received the Golden Club awards from Leon and Walter when the placements were given out. It was a great time. Good Memories!

1980 - 1987

Pete Jordan took over as President and Harry became a director. Frank still was 1st VP. I still can not remember who was the other VP's were. I do know that Ray Wilson and Don Towle and possibly Stan Short was in there somewhere as we used to meet at Kennebec Rental in Fairfield.



Our second sanctioned field trial was held at Pride and Joy Kennels in Windham on May 31 and June 1, 1980. We had Open Gun Dog, Open Derby on Saturday and a pot luck supper and social hour that evening put on by the members and friends. There was an Open All Age run Sunday followed by the Open Puppy. Pride and Joy's Duke of Sebago took home the blue for owner handler Pete Jordan in the Open Gun Dog, 1st in Open Puppy was Pioneer's Lady Jane D'Fritts for owner handler Gerald Houle, 1st in Open Derby was Ms Kelley Channing for owner handler Ken Mercer. 1st in Open All Age was Rondo's Ruff's n Ready for owner handler Ron Stevenson. Other handlers and spectators were Catherine Jordan, Carolyn and Harry Lisewski, Leslie and Jennifer Fleury, Leon Pride, Walter Pride, Mr. & Mrs. Mike Eash, Harold LaCaillade, Mrs. Ken Mercer and daughter, Bill O'Neil, Ted Swierczynski and family, Dave Marshall, Gordeen and Charlie Noble as Charlie was field trial secretary, the Judges were Ray Wilson, Frank Pride Jr., Claude Bourgoin, Pete Jordan, Art Kelley, Ron Stevenson, Danny Nein. I am sure I have missed some.



Our first licensed field trial was held at Pride and Joy Kennels in Windham on Mau 30-31, 1981. Charles Noble was again the field trial secretary for Chairman Frank Pride Jr. If I remember we had a lobster feed that Pete Jordan put on and 99 entries. A busy weekend was had by all. We had entries from all over New England, Judges were Joe Dahl, Daniel Nein, Claude Bourgoin, Pat LaBree, Bill O'Neil, Manny Vagos. Owners, handlers and spectators were Bob Fleury, Horace Aliff, Frank Pride Jr., Tom Corriveau, Dave Ellsworth, Gerald Houle Jr. Dave Marshall, Frank Pride 111, Leland Griffin, Butch Hinson, Leslie & Jennifer Fleury, Charles & Gordeen Noble, Donna Pride, Carolyn & Harry Lisewski, Catherine Jordan, and I am sure I have missed some as the long drive way was lined to the very end. The Derby and Open All Age was run over to the Lambs Farm off Rt. 202.

Frank Pride Jr. was 1st VP until 1983 when he became president however he did resign on July 1. I think that is when George Merkle became president and Frank went to director Lou Ureneck 1st VP. Judy Wedberg was Secretary/Treasurer and Mary Sleeper was 3rd VP. Pete was a director which he has been an officer in one way or another since the start of the club. He has not missed a year that he wasn't the most active member there. In 1986 Lou Ureneck became President, Harry Lisewski Secretary/Treasurer, Gregory Milligan 1st VP. 1987 President Lou Ureneck, Sec/Treas Alton Wedberg, 1st VP Leland Griffin.

1984 was also the year that Mary Sleeper was working so hard to get the CMBC show licensed by AKC. We had plans for a B-Match and a Grooming Demonstration, and possibly a pot luck dinner in mid January. The big discussion among show exhibitors at that time was "do you think hunting dogs should have their whiskers trimmed for the show ring?"

Through the years the club had a lot of hunting seminars at Ken & Jackie Brown's. We also had one at Bruce Christianson's. The seminars always worked out well with a lot of the other breeds participating. CMBC also did Hunt Tests until it became impossible to get members to do the work and that was stopped.

I think we have always had our shows with Vacationland Dog Club until 2001. At that point in time the show was held with Central Maine Kennel Club at the Augusta Civic Center. We did return to Vacationland Dog Club again and had our last show with them in 2006. In 2006 the York County Kennel Club extended an invitation to CMBC to hold it's Designated Specialty with them at the Acton Fairgrounds. At that time our Board voted not to have a show in 2007, to regroup and to consider making changes for the future.



2008 - RINGSIDE 30TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

CMBC accept YCKC's invitation to hold our 2008 Specialty with them in Acton in conjunction with the 30th Anniversary Celebration. Despite the fact that most of the new leadership had no experience in putting on a dog show, this 30th Anniversary Celebration at Acton Fairgrounds will always be remembered in a positive manner. Although the rain poured and the temperature was raw and cold, 13 Brittany exhibitors braved the weather with their dogs. 3rd VP of Shows, Pamela Jackson worked with a new show committee including Hospitality Chair Julie Harris. Julie oversaw the Hospitality Tent which impressed everyone with the wide array of food, beverages, a 30th anniversary cake, information, and a gallery of Brittany photographs displayed. Most of the CMBC leadership was present as Co-Founding member 93 year old Pete Jordan raised a glass of sparkling cider to toast the past, present and future of the club. President John Short, 1st VP Gary Anderson, Directors RO Hager and Ann Short, members Maryann Short Day w/Alana, Karra Folkner, and Leesha Edwards enjoyed visiting with the exhibitors who came from as far away as New Jersey. The highpoint of the day for these members was when both Gibson and J & A's Dreams Come True of Acton won the available championship points!

Although there were enough entries for a 3 pt major in bitches, the major itself was broken.*)

2004 - A TURNING POINT

At the directors meeting on 8/1/2004 the main discussion was dissolving the club. We just could not get members to participate and the club was going behind each year. It was voted to send a letter to the members and have a special meeting in September to vote on dissolving the club. The meeting was held and there was a lot of help that came forward and the club has gone forward.

Since that time we have had great participation in both the field trial and show. With Gary Anderson as 1st VP our field trials have made a profit and had excellent help from the members. It was also changed to a walking trial and worked out well.

Although the show has gone behind we expect that this will change in the future.

2005 - 2008 FUN DAYS REVISITED

In July 2005 a member expressed convictions that within the membership of CMBC lies a vast, deep wealth of information, help, advice, experience, guidance and more. It was felt the membership was rich with experience and knowledge which should be tapped into for the future success of the club. President R.O. Hager was presented with an idea to provide an opportunity for CMBC to reach out to some new Brittany owners with hopes to increase membership, get some "new blood", and energize the club. President Hager quickly gave his thumbs up.

On August 27th a Summer Field and Fun Day was organized and hosted by the Shorts at their home in Acton, Maine. The day included a buffet style picnic and BBQ, show and training techniques/demos for the Brittany, basic grooming, tips about puppy care, basic dog training,

question and answers, raffles, give aways and more. It provided an enjoyable social opportunity for the dogs and their owners in a relaxed non-competitive environment. There was a very good turnout by many club members, some who had never attended a CMBC event and many who had never met before. There were @ 21 Brittanyes and 30 humans!

The Summer Field and Fun Day was repeated again in 2006 and in 2007. Each year offered additional opportunities for Brittany owners and their dogs to meet, socialize and learn from each other in a non-competitive atmosphere. The generosity of The Lion Club Supply, The Kong Company, The Upland Almanac, and The Kennel Store made it possible for fundraising raffles and give-aways each year. In 2007 two new demonstrations were added; Agility and a mock dog show.

In 2008, 44 individuals (16 of whom were members) and their families came with 17 Brittanyes. In addition to what had been available before there was a Flyball Demonstration, show handling tips, basic puppy evaluation information, and a presentation about Maine animal welfare/rights legislation. President John Short had special hats made to commemorate the CMBC 30th Anniversary which were sold at Fun Day.

Frank & Donna Pride, Bob Paucek, Karen Gatchell, Leslie Hunt, Pamela Jackson, Karra Folkner, Jay Kitchener, Gary Anderson, Julie Harris, Ann Short, Dr. Jessie Perks DVM, GW Pottle are among those who have presented information, done training demos, shared experiences etc. while President John Short has served as chef & grillmaster.



2007 - 2008 LEARNING DAYS ADDED

In response to frequent requests made of new Brittany owners and/or those who want to learn how to properly train their Brittany for hunting or field trialing CMBC has started to offer unique training opportunities for members and friends.

In May 2007 the first “Learning Day” was organized by Field Trial President Gary Andreson and held in Brownfield at the Maine Bird Dog Grounds. Pro-trainer and longtime friend of CMBC Bob Paucek worked with a excited group of people and their dogs. It was such a success that it was repeated again in the Spring and Summer of 2008 only this time our own Frank Pride Jr. was on hand to teach newcomers to the sport of field trialing how to handle their dogs in the field. The May training was held at Cedar Ridge Pheasants in Greenbush, Maine on private grounds owned by an individual who raises birds and offers his property for gundog training. New member Lisa Talsby participated with Hero. Also braving the pouring rain was the Fournier family; Joe, Erica and their toddler son with their Brittany Rosco.

Julie Harris brought Sassy, and Ann Short brought Treasure. Gary had Lisa, Lola, and Jacque. Frank and Donna brought Suzie. The Prides used “Sam” and “Smoke“ to demonstrate how a trained Brittany should work on and hunt birds. The E-Z up tents sagged with water, the raingear was either proven or not, and both human and canine looked like drowned rats not to mention the killer mosquitoes. But it did not deter anyone as Gary offered hospitality at his nearby home for everyone to bring their bag lunches and get dried out.



It was a good time to relax and catch up with the Prides as they shared about their incredible experience in Grand Junction Tennessee when Frank was inducted into the Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame and Donna also awarded and recognized for her many years of support.

was handled by Tania Lewandowski. The Amateur Gun Dog was run with 10 entries with the Blue going to Locar's Right Hand Man who was handled by Joe Wessling. I want to thank all those who participated in the trial and the Committee members and friends who helped this trial be a success. See you in the new year."
